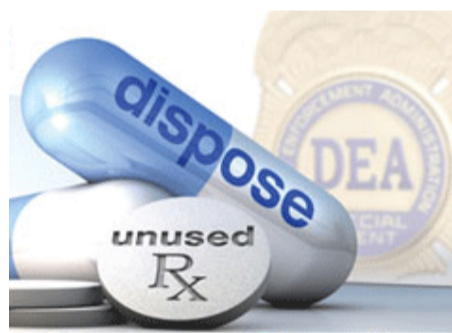
FALL PUMPKIN FESTIVAL
